Honoring the Father of American Golf

Fittingly, the first playing of the Findlay Cup was won at Reading Country Club on the third hole, described by Alexander Findlay as "...one of the nicest holes to play." That was surely the sentiment of Greg Galtere and Matt Hadley, who outlasted the duo of Chris Gallo and Travis Peck on the third playoff hole.

The Findlay Cup honors Mr. Findlay, considered the 'father of American golf.' The two-day competition was contested at Galen Hall Golf Club, Wernersville, Pa., and Reading Country Club, Reading, Pa., on May 16 and 17. These are among some 200 golf course Mr. Findlay designed and built in a career that began in the era of hickory shafts and carried on through steel shafted clubs.

After the first day at Galen Hall, the Galtere-Hadley team tied the Gallo-Peck team with a best-ball score of 71, one under par. The teams each shot 72, two over par, on Sunday at Reading.

The competitors included Rich Findlay, Alex Findlay's grandson, and his wife Cece. Rich Findlay maintains a web site dedicated to his grandfather's accomplishments, http://alexanderfindlay.com/

"The three-hole playoff provided an exciting conclusion to the Findlay Cup," said Tom Morgan, Director of Golf at RCC. Rich presented Greg and Matt with a copy of the document to the right, which was given to his grandfather. The document, on Augusta National Golf Club letterhead, was signed by the competitors in the second Masters – known then as the Augusta National Invitational – played in 1935. The tournament became known as the Masters in 1939.
