**Cotton Hirneisen** won a record seven Berks Publinks titles between 1957 and 1984. He also won the state Publinks four times and the state senior Publinks five times. His 103 tournament wins include the 1978 Berks Amateur championship.

### Lefty, Gix, Mutz and Cotton Public Course Players Take Center Stage

The Berks County Public Links championship is one of the oldest tournaments in the domain. The tournament was established in 1931 under sponsorship of the City of Reading Recreation Department. This was just two years after the Berks County Golf Association's first amateur championship.

Reading Country Club hosted the Berks County Public Links Championship for the first time in 2015. **Bill Allen** won his second title over a field of 30 players.

That it took 84 years for the Publinks to come to RCC is no surprise. RCC did not become a public course until 2006.

The first Berks County Publinks tournament in 1931 attracted about 100 entries to the now-defunct Riverside Golf Club in Muhlenberg Township. Match play was the game in the early years. This format required a qualifying round to determine flights. The tournament consumed four and sometimes five weekends.

Participation was open to residents of Berks County. Members of country clubs were ineligible, as were caddies and all employees of golf clubs.

Medal play was first used in 1965, with the low 20 qualifiers playing 72 holes. The remaining flights went to match play.

Galen Hall Golf Club staged the tournament from 1982 to 2013, with **Frank Schnee** as tournament director. Because of declining entries, the Publinks was not played in 2014. The Berks County Golf Association added the tournament to its schedule for the first time in 2015. This followed a two-year run of a BCGA Publinks partner's tournament at Flying Hills Golf Club in 2013 and Rich-Maiden Golf Club in 2014. That event did not attract a sufficient number of entries to sustain it, so the BCGA filled the Publinks void with the individual tournament.

This was not the first time the Publinks nearly expired. By 1969, interest in the Publinks waned to the point that the City Recreation Department cancelled the event because of a lack of entries. **Buddy** and **Harold Heckman**, operators of Manor Golf Club, stepped forward to stage an 18-hole tournament. **Jack Shollenberger**, the defending champion, won with a 67 at Manor GC on September 6. The Recreation Department resumed sponsorship and continued though the early 1980s.

A women's Publinks was added in 1974. **Wilma Holland** won the inaugural event, played at Willow Hollow GC. The women's Publinks was last played in 1990 at Galen Hall, Kelly Emes winning her second consecutive championship.

#### **Publinks Hijinks**

- Wilmer "Lefty" Faber was the first "pure" public-course golfer to win the Berks Amateur. He accomplished the feat in 1939, the same year he won the Publinks for the first time. Faber defeated 17-year-old Johnny Markel, the defending champion, 1-up at RCC for the Berks Am crown. Byron Nelson, the RCC pro and reigning U.S. Open champion, served as the walking referee for the match. This was Faber's only Berks Am; Markel won the championship seven times before turning pro.
- Although **Bob Dinsmore** (1934, '35 and '37) and **Dr. A.J. McDowell** (1931 and '36) won the Berks Am prior to 1939 as public-course players (members of Riverside GC), each had previously belonged to a private club.
- Harold Brossman, 1943 Publinks champion, had to go through the Faber brothers on his way to the championship. He defeated Lefty, 2 and 1, in the morning and Charlie, the defending Publinks champion, 3 and 2, in the afternoon. Brossman won the Publinks title the next day with a 1-up victory over Buddy Heckman in the 36-hole final played at Riverside GC.

The most noteworthy USGA Men's Publinks championship was the 2005 edition, held in Lebanon, Ohio. A 15-year-old **Michelle Wie** was on a quest to become the first female winner, which would have earned her an invitation to the Masters. She advanced to the match play rounds, losing in the quarterfinals to **Clay Ogden**, who went on to win the tournament.

#### **Major Publinkers**

**Trevor Immelman** became the first Publinks champion (1998) to win a professional major championship with his victory at the 2008 Masters. His playing partner in the final round, **Brandt Snedeker**, won the Publinks in 2003.

Michelle Wei and Yani Tseng, winners of the Women's Publinks championship, have also won professional majors.

Other Publinks winners who enjoyed success on the PGA tour include Jody Mudd, Billy Mayfair, Tim Clark and Ryan Moore.

- Bucky Spangler, winner of the first Publinks in 1931, was witness to history in 1937.
  On the afternoon of April 19, he played in a foursome at RCC that included Stan Giles (the 1909 Berks County high school tennis champion who became Reading's first police commissioner in 1932), Al Ashmore and the host professional, Byron Nelson.
  Lord Byron shot a course-record 65, breaking the record of 67 he set that same morning. The 67 eclipsed the 68 carded by professional George Low, Jr., of Philadelphia, in the 1936 Central Pennsylvania Open. The course played to a par of 71, with the 10<sup>th</sup> hole a par 4, the 12<sup>th</sup> a par 5 and the 17<sup>th</sup> a par 4.
- The Berks Publinks debuted four years before the state tournament. The first Pennsylvania Publinks championship was played in 1935.
- Manor Golf Club hosted the 1950 Pennsylvania Publinks. Wally "Skipper" Kilrea, Jr., a 17-year-old from Hershey, defended his championship with rounds of 73-75-71-72—291, 15 over par. Ernie Meckley, Manor GC, was second at 297, Dom Foscone of Green Hills GC was ninth at 302 and John Yocum, Green Hills, was 12<sup>th</sup> at 305.
- In a July 25, 1950, newspaper article, Buddy Heckman, winner of the Berks Publinks in 1944, '46, '47 and '48 and the state Publinks in 1947 and 1948 at Hershey, predicted a state Publinks winning score of 280, or +4, for the 5,550-yard, par 69 Manor course. Heckman turned pro after his 1948 victory and was ineligible for the Publinks. Heckman, the assistant pro at Berkshire CC, shot a record 61 at Manor earlier that month.
- Public links players were permitted to play in the Berks Amateur Championship for the first time in 1931. The first two Berks Ams were restricted to members of the BCGA member clubs, Berkleigh, Berkshire and Reading. Hawley Quier won the first Berks Am in 1929 at Berkshire. Carmi Hicks won in 1930 at Reading. In 1931 at Berkleigh, 286 golfers posting qualifying scores over the nine-hole layout. Billy Bair and Earle Biehl were co-medalists at 86. Dr. A.L. McDowell defeated Biehl for the championship.
- Michelle Wie played the qualifying tournament for the 2004 USGA Men's Publinks championship as a 14-year old. The qualifier was played on June 18 at Manada Golf Club, Grantville, Pa. Played in a threesome with Andy Levering, Berks Publinks champion in 1997 and 2001, Wie shot a pair of two-under-par 71s to miss qualifying by two strokes. Levering shot 167.

#### The USGA Publinks

The United States Golf Association established the amateur public links championship in 1922 for golfers who played on public courses. At that time, entry into the U.S. amateur championship was restricted to members of clubs that were affiliated with the USGA or other national governing bodies. Members of private clubs were barred from entry into the Publinks. In 1979, entry into the U.S. Amateur was opened to all amateurs, whether or not they were club members. In February 2013, the USGA announced that the Publinks would be discontinued after its 2014 edition, and would be replaced by a new men's amateur four-ball championship.

The first Publinks, won by **Edmund R. Held**, was played at the Ottawa Park Course, Toledo, Ohio. The event grew from 140 entries in 1922 to over 6,000 in 1998.

Byron Meath won the final Publinks at Sand Creek Station Golf Course, Newton, Kansas.

The U.S. Women's Amateur Public Links, first played in 1977 at Yahara Hills Golf club, Madison, Wisc., was also discontinued after 2014 and replaced by a four-ball tournament. Winners include **Yani Tseng** (2004), who has won five professional major championships, and **Michelle Wei** (2003), with one professional major. Wei won the Publinks at age 13, the youngest player ever to win an adult U.S.G.A. championship. She first qualified for the Publinks in 2000 at age 10.

In the final women's Publinks, staged at The Home Course, Tacoma, Wash., 15-year-old **Fumie (Alice) Jo** made history by becoming the first player from mainland China to win a USGA title when she outlasted 14-year-old **Eun Jeong Seong**, South Korea, 3 and 2.

#### **Going Low**

**Cotton Hirneisen** has the most Men's Publinks wins with seven (1957, '60, '62, '63, '65, '66, '84), his first and last wins separated by 27 years. He set the 72-hole tournament scoring record of 64-64-71-65—264, 16 under par, in 1965 at Manor GC.

The 36-hole tournament record of 136 is held by **Jack Shollenberger**, 1976 at Galen Hall GC, and **Craig Gilbert**, 1980 at Exeter GC.

The 18-hole tournament record of 67 is shared by **Dick Arms**, 1968 at Willow Hollow GC; **Jack Shollenberger**, 1969 at Manor GC; and **Herman Fry**, 1972 at Flying Hills GC.

Bill Schultz won the most consecutive titles with four (2003-'06).

**Sharon Porter** (1987) and **Kelly Emes** (1990) share the Women's Publinks scoring record of 157 for 36 holes at Galen Hall GC.

**Kay Geitner** and **Wilma Holland** won the most Women's Publinks titles with three and Geitner has most consecutive titles with three (1976, '77 and '78).
